A Reflection on Today's Gospel

The Gospel this weekend speaks of an easy yoke and a light burden. Jesus invites those who are burdened to come to him and to learn meekness and humbleness of heart. The followers of Jesus are lifelong learners as they uncover an ever deeper understanding of what it means to be a disciple. Jesus is the teacher who continuously reveals the Father to those who come to him. And the yoke that one accepts is not the burden of

the law of the Pharisees, but the easy yoke of life in Christ.

This is the difference between those oxen who turn a Persian wheel and the disciple of Christ. The oxen go round and round all the day long. Their circular path is never ending and though they walk the whole day, they do not go anywhere. Their labor is productive, but not life-changing. The disciple who takes on the yoke of Christ

accepts his invitation to walk with him. In doing so, we take on the burden of learning from Christ. Think back to the Eight Beatitudes we heard so many months ago. Those eight precepts are the law that Jesus expects his followers to live under, the yoke that we take on in our Christian lives. The beatitudes are the wellspring that nurtures our lives.

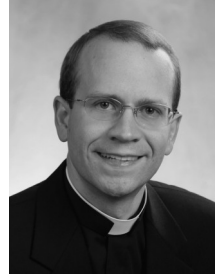

Parish Maintenance Update...

I'm sure you have noticed that our "bells" sound different. Our old system, which is contained in a electronic box, has been having a lot of problems ringing on time for Mass and for other programmed events, the Angelus at noon and 6 pm. The bell company brought us a loaner while they check to see if the old system can be fixed or updated. We are sorry it's so loud, but are working to get it back to it's reasonable volume. Say a prayer that the old system can be repaired.

We will be doing some major work on our main church roof this summer. We need to replace the roof on the north side of the church (the tabernacle side) and at the same time replace the air conditioning units that sit on that roof. This will be a \$80,000-plus project that has been put off for quite a few years and just can't wait any longer. When this project occurs we can also do some electrical repair work on the chapel air conditioning.

All of our roofs and a/c units and even the bells are showing their age....I guess just like we all are! Just thought you would like to know.....

THE GOOD NEWS

It's no sin to wear stylish clothes and eat the latest craze in food, but pressure to "go with the flow" in some ways can be very tough to resist. We often give in because we don't REALLY want to be too different from our friends. The Scriptures, however, say that to live like Jesus Christ is a decision to make decisions that go against the culture in painful ways—such as choosing against abortion, or against gossip or vengeance, or living more simply — things that can be painful, or even cause us to lose friends. It can be hard to take up our crosses with Jesus. But when living life gets tough, Jesus invites us gently, "Come to me, you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest....Take my yoke upon you...For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

In Jesus' time, the yokes for the oxen were measured and tailor-made to fit the animal, so it would not rub and injure its skin. Can you picture Jesus carefully tailoring your sufferings and challenges to fit your needs and abilities exactly? This is not the "best-selling" view of life! To believe it, we have to see ourselves completely in God's hands, gently being shaped and directed according to God's wisdom, instead of our own.

Come, try out life with Jesus and go "against the flow" to live as He asks us.

Your yoke will be a perfect fit, and Jesus promises you will find rest and lightness for your soul.

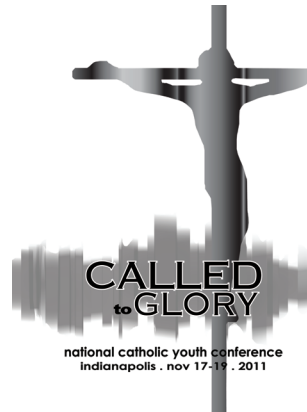

To avoid confusion between the current and revised versions of the Mass, however, the new translation is not permitted to be used in the liturgy until it is officially promulgated on November 27, 2011.

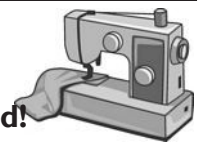
