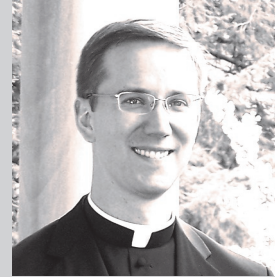

What a gift we received from Jesus - His Body and Blood to nourish our faith all the days of our lives.

My thanks to our Religious Education Coordinator, Jean Carr and her staff, Kim Flynn and Laura Shawhan, to the teachers in our Religious Education Program, Lisa Hayes and Amy Spowart. and our school teachers, Catherine Warneke, Dee Campbell and Nancy Lakes for the many hours they spent preparing these children. My blessings and appreciation to the parents of the First Communicants for entrusting us to be a part of their child's life long faith journey. You are all in my daily prayers....

Next Saturday, May 21st, our seminary intern, Deacon Dan Hess, will be ordained to the priesthood at St. Peter in Chains Cathedral in Cincinnati. He will celebrate his first Mass in our parish on Saturday, May 28th, at 4:30 pm. A reception will be held after the Mass in our Parish Center. Plan to join us. ## THE GOOD NEWS

Christ refers to us as his sheep and to himself as our shepherd. Jesus says he is *our* guardian who promise to care for us always: "Whoever enters the sheepfold through me will be safe." If we develop a whole-hearted relationship of love and trust in Christ, he will protect us from harm, especially from the harm of spiritual death through sin an evil.

Sheep get disoriented easily: they lose their path, and wander in confusion. Just as Christ knows us intimately, the shepherd really knows what the sheep need. The bottom line for us Catholics is this: *to be fully human, we don't "just exist" — we must enter a deep relationship with God.* This means listening to the voice of Christ by private and group prayer, and by listening to the stories of faith others tell us.

Intimacy with Christ demands intimacy with others. We pray to hear exactly HOW God's voice is calling us to bring our gifts to others. The point is to use our relationship with Christ for the good of the world — whether single, married, or in religious life. What is the Lord calling us to do with our life? Are we being called to a religious vocation?

God is the only true place of safety for our heart and soul. Let us trust our Master, Christ, to lead us into lives that accomplish God's will for us all.

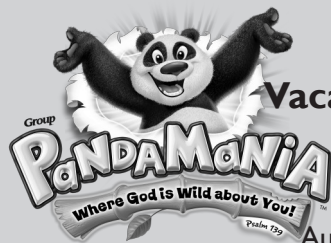

**Q:** What are some examples of the changes made to the prayers at Mass?

**A:** A change everyone will notice at the very beginning of Mass is the people's response to the priest's greeting, "The Lord be with you." In place of the words "And also with you," the congregation will reply "And with your spirit" - wording that better reflects the biblical language of St. Paul in his letters (see Galatians 6:18; Philippians 4:23; 2 Timothy 4:22) and recognizes the unique work of the Holy Spirit through the ordained priest to celebrate the Eucharist.

People will also notice a change in the opening word of the Nicene Creed. Instead of saying "We believe in one God...", the congregation will begin "I believe in one God..." a more personal expression of faith - as well as a more literal translation of the Latin text of the Creed.

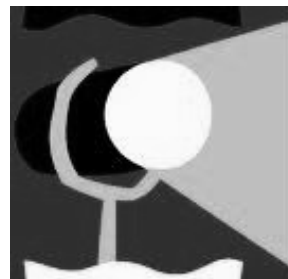

### What is Mystagogy?

Mystagogy, the fourth and final stage of the RCIA process, is the ongoing instruction in the mysteries of the faith that follows reception into the Church. Mystagogy is meant to

deepen the experience of initiation after the Easter Vigil.

*It's a time for settling in.* Have you ever started a new job? A new school? A new family? It's exciting to begin, but those first steps can be wobbly. We rely on people around us to help us feel at home. That's the purpose of mystagogy. The tasks of deepening one's grasp of the *Paschal Mystery* -- making the Gospel part of one's life through meditation, sharing in the Eucharist and performing works of charity.

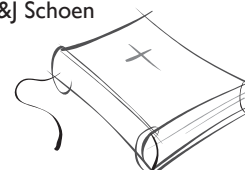
