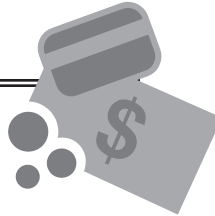

What is SCRIP?

You see it mentioned all the time, but what is it? **SCRIP** stands for **School Rewards and Incentive Program**. It allows organizations to receive a percentage of sales from various participating stores. Currently the PTO uses SCRIP for Kohls, Graeters, Meijer, Kroger, and Dorothy Lane Market.

If you currently are using the **Dorothy Lane Market** gift cards (sold in \$50.00 increments), simply go to the Service Desk and they can re-load them for you, the St. Albert Code is **1010**.

Already doing your shopping at **Kohls**? If so, pre-order your gift cards through our SCRIP program, pre-loaded cards are available for pick up at the Rectory office. These gift cards are sold in \$25.00 increments.

We also have a rewards program available with **Meijer**. If you shop Meijer, log onto www.meijer.com/rewards and register for the Community Rewards Program. The St. Albert school ID is **328018**.

Participating in SCRIP does not cost any extra money. The biggest rewards for St. Albert come from **Kroger**. Pick up a Kroger gift card at Rectory, and before you check out at Kroger load your card with the amount of money you are planning to spend. Next, simply use the now loaded card to pay for your groceries.

A percentage of your purchase will then go towards PTO funded items such as Muse Machine and busing for field trips.

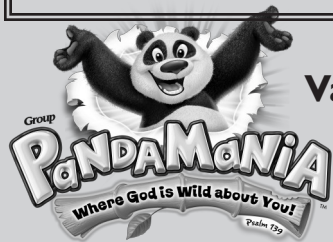

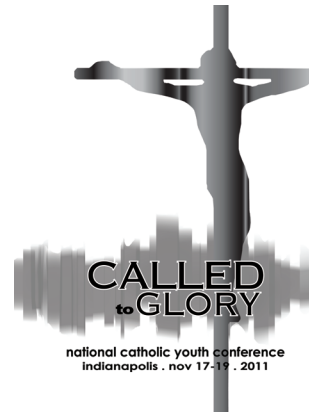

RCIA VOCABULARY LESSON

What is a Sponsor?

A sponsor is an active Catholic that is willing to be a companion to someone going through the RCIA process. As they get acquainted they listen, answer questions, pray together, and connect them with the parish. Sponsors find their role to be one that enriches and deepens their own faith as well. It is a very rewarding experience. As one sponsor said, "I am learning and growing at a better pace than if I had not sponsored someone. It is very exciting to hear the questions they ask and to see them evolve through the process." Sponsors are not meant to have all the answers (in fact, it is better if they don't). Their main role is to be a friend and companion ON the journey.
